People not only had a chance to network but to look at opportunities for developing a multi-agency approach to addressing some of the most challenging needs of the people in our communities.

Building Futures Big Local SW11 has been piloting a new initiative



which offers free guidance and advice to anyone living in the area that might need help getting into work. Run by adviser Dustine Davis at the Katherine Low Settlement each Wednesday from 2pm-5pm, the service has supported 14 people, three of whom have gained



employment! This could be a staggering result, and the project is currently being evaluated with a full report going to our Partnership Executive Committee in May.

As we go to press, Building Futures is developing a three year programme of measures

that support local people into work, training, and/or volunteering/mentoring, and other actions that build selfreliance. Watch this space!
